Interviews 101

Prepare: (Technical) Company agnostic

How to prepare for technical interviews



Generic technical prep

- **Coding**

- Plan
- Break it down
 - Start with Cracking the coding interview book.
 - Practice coding! For example, how about 1 easy, 1 medium and 1 hard problem a day? (~2-3 hours)

- **System design**

- For a graduate hire, it's important you know all the concepts. However, it is not expected that you have industry experience in scaling distributed systems [<https://www.hiredintech.com/system-design> or Grokking the system design interview]



Prepare: (Technical) Company specific

How to prepare for technical interviews

Guidelines on the interview process, preparation for each of the interviews

- Understand the interview process
 - What is expected of you at each stage?
- Ask clarifying questions on the process, and request for any resources available
 - “Are there any books or blog posts that I can read?”
- Prepare role-specific action plan
 - Identify knowledge gaps
 - Implement side projects
 - Time-box
- Prepare questions for each round (take the time to think about questions in advance)





Prepare: Non-technical interviews

How to prepare for non-technical and behavioral interviews



1 Who are you outside of your resume?
Showcase your personality wherever you can

2 How well do you know your resume? What don't you know much about?
Honesty, Transparency and Clarity

3 What have you worked on?
Ability to describe technical aspects in detail. High level overview to detailed work you have done

4 What are your takeaways from each project?
Growth mindset, self awareness, STAR

5 Would you do things differently?
Ability to learn, and think through different solutions

6 Communication, Collaboration, Culture diversity
What are you bringing to the table? Would you fit into the existing ecosystem while also bringing in a diverse point of view?

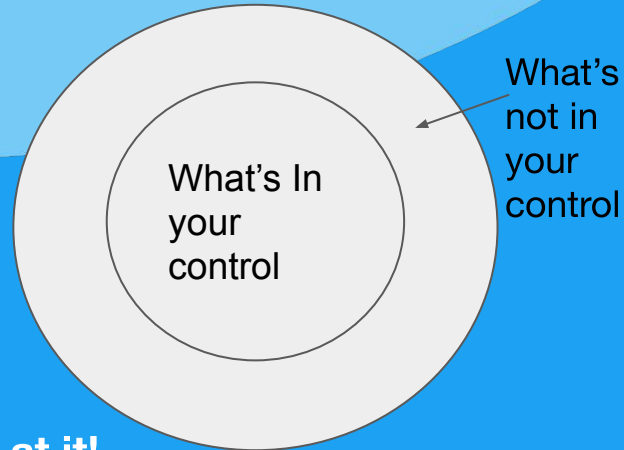
