- All resources and printing ready



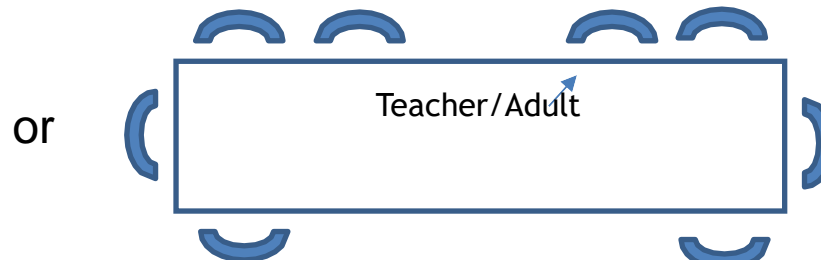
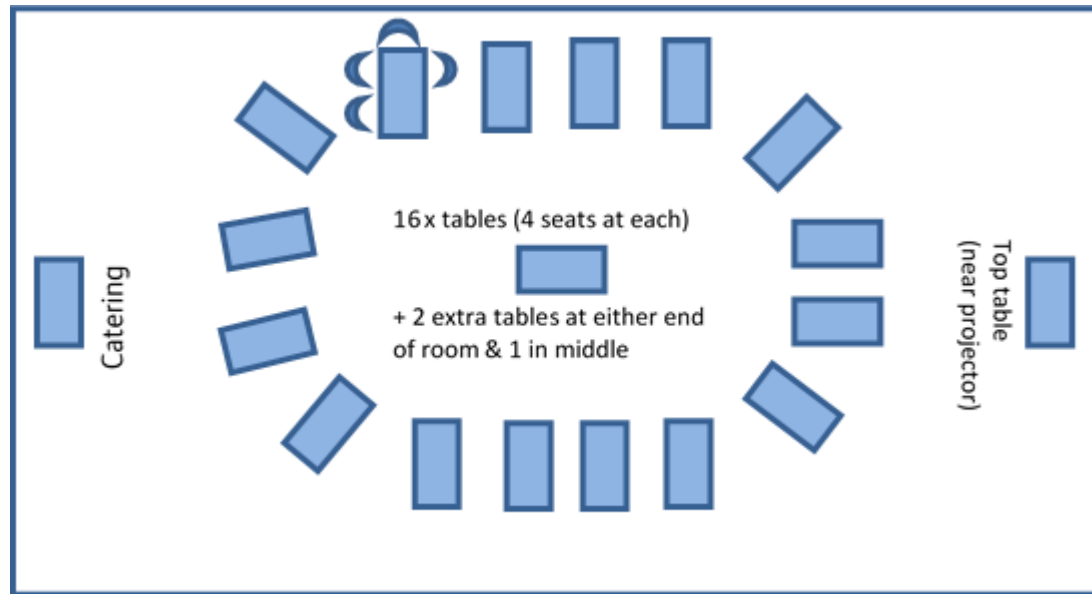

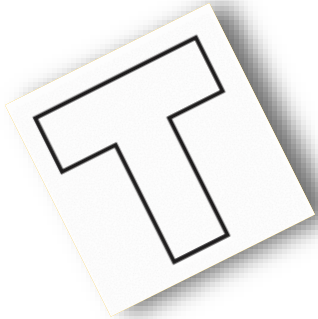


Setting Up your Tournament space

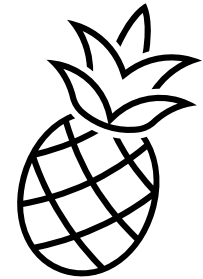
This is an example layout – and is how we set out the room for the Heats.



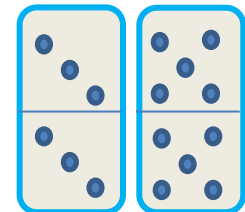

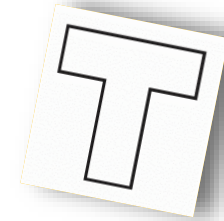

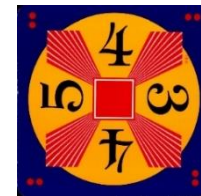
